We've delivered our highest ever number of therapeutic sessions for children this year as you will see in this report; a huge 28% uplift on last year. Children's Mental Health

The Scale of the Problem

In 2022, 18% of 7-16 year olds and 22% of 17-24 year olds had a mental health difficulty.

In 2022, Nearly 13% of children with a mental health difficulty missed more than 15 days of school compared with 4% of those unlikely to have a mental disorder. (Mental Health of Children and Young People in England, 2022. NHS Digital)

More than 1 in 4 (29%) 7-16 year olds with a mental health difficulty lived in households which experienced a reduction in income in 2022. (Mental Health of Children and Young People in England, 2022. NHS Digital)

In 2022, 11-16 year olds with a mental health difficulty (61%) were also less likely to feel safe at school than those without (89%), and were less likely to enjoy learning or to have a friend they could turn to for support.



Supporting children with Play & Creative Arts Therapy in Schools

Clear Sky supports Primary, Secondary and Specialist schools by providing individual and group Play and Creative Arts Therapy.

We have continued building and maintaining longer term partnerships with schools across Oxfordshire and beyond. More children are being supported with longer, more meaningful interventions than ever before.

Our therapists have also had more opportunity to support children with their transition from primary to secondary school, giving that much needed support at a time of change.

Support and training for School Staff

Clear Sky supports schools through specialised and adaptable training which focuses on the importance of relationships and provides staff with play-based strategies that can be implemented throughout school to support social, emotional, and mental health needs, and which positively impacts behaviour.

Our training programmes include Adult-Child Attachment Play (ACAP), Space to Shine, mentoring and support and can be delivered in a variety of formats including INSET days, workshops and twilight sessions.



Play for Parents

Supporting parents to use child-led play to promote emotional wellbeing for their children

We offer a number of parenting support programmes in the community which support families from birth to early adulthood. These programmes are delivered to groups of parents, or parents and child together.

In 2023 we were fortunate to be able to gift three parenting support programmes to parents and carers, including to two groups of refugee families who had been displaced through conflict.

Our parenting courses enable families to develop resilience, confidence and the skills to form secure attached relationships.

In the past 12 months, Moonbeams CIC has become an Associate Trainer for Clear Sky Children's Charity. We are now able to offer their suite of attachment courses to organisations and individuals who support children and families in the West Midlands and surrounding areas.

So far we have trained 28 practitioners in the Heart to Heart and Parent-Child Attachment Play (PCAP) approaches and continue to support them as they embed their practice in their respective communities.

Practitioners are drawn from a range of disciplines including Play Therapists, Family Support workers, Pastoral Support and Speech and Language Therapists. We will also be delivering Heart to Heart to students and staff members from the Early Years Course at Coventry University and we are very much looking forward to delivering further courses in the near future.
